

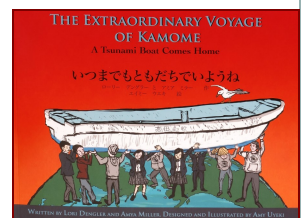


**BACK TO THE FUTURE: REMEMBERING THE

The M 7.2 Cape Mendocino earthquake of April 25, 1992 and its M 6.6 and 6.7 aftershocks caused over \$60 million in losses and is the only Humboldt County earthquake to gain a FEMA major disaster declaration. This talk recounts what happened in 1992, the preparedness programs the sequence launched both regionally and nationwide, and how it raised awareness of the Cascadia subduction zone.

Dr. Lori Dengler is an emeritus Professor of Geology at Humboldt State University. She was part of the team that developed the National Tsunami Hazard Mitigation Program and a participant in a dozen post earthquake and tsunami field survey teams including Papua New Guinea, Indonesia, Chile and Japan. Recognized as HSU's Scholar of the Year in 2008 and recipient of California's 2009 Alquist medal for earthquake preparedness efforts, Lori continues to work on outreach projects. She is the author of a bilingual children's book "The Extraordinary Voyage of Kamome" and a biweekly column in the *Eureka Times-Standard*.
